What We Learned in 2021

The year 2021 was marked with many adjustments, plans and successes for the Liverpool Public Library. We approached 2021 with the intent of moving forward after the events of 2020, and I'm pleased to say we did just that.

In May 2021, the LPL was able to fully reopen our doors to the public. The excitement continued into the summer months, as we launched our new summer reading program, "Let's Read, Liverpool!" The program encouraged patrons to simply read, without the stress of logging books. Over 1,101 people throughout the Liverpool community participated in the program and pledged to read, showing that we were ready to embrace this new approach to summer reading.

To balance COVID restrictions during the summer months, we moved many of our programs outside. With the purchase of a tent for our Dinosaur Garden, we were able to hold many programs without weather concerns. In addition to our outdoor programs, we offered more hybrid programming to accommodate our patrons who were unable to make it inside our library. This hybrid model is just one example of the adjustment we made, and will continue to make, to meet the needs of our community.

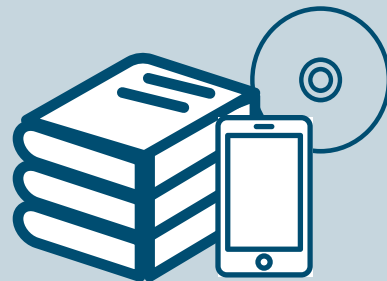
LPL also went fine free in 2021. Starting July 1, 2021, the LPL waived late fees in an effort to expand access to our resources. We hope in reducing this potential barrier we will see more members of our community.

Lastly, 2021 marked the completion of our renovation project. The Children's Room renovation was complete, with new shelving, an Interactive Play area, pixel and weaving walls, and much more. We're proud of the work that was accomplished on this project and enjoy seeing how much use it gets from our younger patrons.

Generosity was also a theme of 2021. We hosted several donation drives in 2021, including a drive for the CNY Food Bank through our Haunted Halloween Garage, a Toy Drive and a mitten drive. All the donations for these events far exceeded our expectations and showed just how much our community cares.

With 2022 underway, we are looking forward to continuing the positive momentum from 2021. Thank you for letting us be a part of your community.
